- Today is the memorial of St. Denis, bishop and martyr.
- Very little details exist on the life of St. Denis other than he was the first bishop of Paris in the early 3rd century.
- He was martyred during the persecutions of the emperor Decius in the year 250 AD.
- He was taken to the highest hill in parish what is now known as "the Mount of Martyrs" and beheaded.
- Pious legend says after the beheading, he got up, picked up his head, and walked six miles ... all the way preaching to the assembled crowds.
- He is the patron saint of Paris and France, and is also the patron of those with headaches.
- In today's Gospel, Our Lord admonishes us to persevere in prayer. God answers our prayers in His time and in His way ... not always the way we might expect or want.
- As we approach this altar to receive the Sacred Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, let us pray for a spirit of zeal and perseverance ... so that we may, like St. Denis, show forth the glory of God throughout our lives.
