The motto "In God we trust" has been inscribed on one and two cent coins since 1864 ... In 1873, it was allowed on all coins, and in 1908 it became mandatory on all coins. In 1957, it became mandatory on all paper money, and also became an alternate motto for our nation.

In today's Gospel, we hear Our Lord speak on His testimony ... And that whoever accepts the testimony of Jesus Christ "certifies that God is trustworthy."

Which leads us to our own reflection ... Do we truly trust in God? Last weekend was Divine Mercy Sunday ... At the bottom of the image of Jesus, the Divine Mercy is the motto "Jesus, I trust in You."

The priest who brought the Divine Mercy devotion to the United States admonishes those who will hear him that we should all trust in Jesus MORE.

As we approach this altar to receive the Sacred Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, let us ask for the graces we need to trust God ... To trust Jesus ... Even more ... In all areas of ourselves and our lives.
